What is an electric toothbrush?

- A toothbrush with a rechargeable or replaceable battery that powers the bristles to rotate and
 oscillate. This provides a better, more thorough clean of your teeth and gums, doing a better job
 at breaking up food particles and plaque.
- Recommended by many dentists and dental hygienists.
- They are easy to use, requiring less manual movement and potentially harmful scrubbing.

Why switch to an electric toothbrush?

- **Better plaque removal:** Bristles move more freely and deeply around your teeth, preventing you from scrubbing too hard and missing spots.
- Ease of use: The brush does much of the work for you, guiding you along.
- Built-in timers: Confirms that you brush for the recommended two minutes per session.
- Potential improvements in oral hygiene: Teeth feel cleaner, and you may get better feedback from the dentist.
- **Recommendations by dental professionals**: Many dental professionals recommend electric toothbrushes.

Types of electric toothbrushes

- Oscillating-rotating: A round brush head oscillates in a circular motion, 2,500-7,500 times per minute.
- Sonic: Works even faster at up to 30,000+ brushes per minute for a faster and better clean.
- **Ultrasonic**: Less common, moves at up to 2,400,000 times per minute with you just holding the brush to your teeth. Some sonic models have ultrasonic modes.
- Battery operated vs. rechargeable: Replaceable battery models are cheaper, great for travel, but less powerful. Rechargeable come with bases and have more advanced features but are more expensive.
- **Kids electric toothbrush:** Specifically designed for young ones in smaller size and fun designs.





Key features to consider

- Brushing modes: Can include options like deep cleaning, whitening, sensitivity, tongue cleaning, and gum massaging.
- Battery life and charging options: AC adapter or USB, wireless, replaceable.
- Smart features: App for guidance, timers, even visuals, useful notifications, and brushing history.
- **Pressure sensors**: Tells you if you're scrubbing or pressing too hard.
- Brush head compatibility: Consider price, how easy they are to find, third-party compatibility, and subscription options.
- **Design and comfort**: Should be easy to grip and maneuver, easy to change head, quiet operation.
- Age rating: For kids, get one appropriate for their age and size.
- Accessories: Charging base, cord, extra brush heads, additional tools, travel case.
- Partner apps: Android or iOS, easy connection, intuitive, provides useful assistance.

Price vs. value

- Price is usually reflective of durability, longevity, power.
- Battery-operated are good as entry options, for kids, or as secondary brushes for travel.
- Consider bundles with accessories or multiple brushes.

User reviews and brand reputation

- Don't just look at star ratings, read user feedback to make a judgement.
- Opt for an electric toothbrush from a trusted brand.
- Customer support is important.

Eco-friendly and sustainable options

- Models made from sustainable materials like bamboo with biodegradable brush heads.
- Recyclable packaging.
